



Fiscal Year 2027 Federal Legislative Agenda

Please Support Habitat's Federal Priorities:

Provide robust funding for vital investments in housing and community development programs that expand opportunity and strengthen communities. These programs play a critical role in advancing economic prosperity, leveraging federal dollars with private-sector investment to increase housing production. We urge Congress to provide strong funding for key programs in the FY2027 budget:



Agriculture, Rural Development, FDA bill:

- **USDA 502 SF Direct Loans** | \$1.25 billion

Transportation, Housing & Urban Development bill:

- **Self-Help Homeownership Opportunity** | \$20 million
- **Home Investment Partnerships Program** | \$1.5 billion
- **Section 4 Capacity Building** | \$50 Million
- **Community Development Block Grants** | \$3.3 billion

Financial Services and General Government bill:

- **CDFI Fund** | \$324 million

Labor, Health, & Human Services, & Education bill:

- **AmeriCorps** | \$1.26 billion



Create a Federal **Homeownership Supply Accelerator**, a new flexible source of funding dedicated solely to increasing the supply of starter homes.

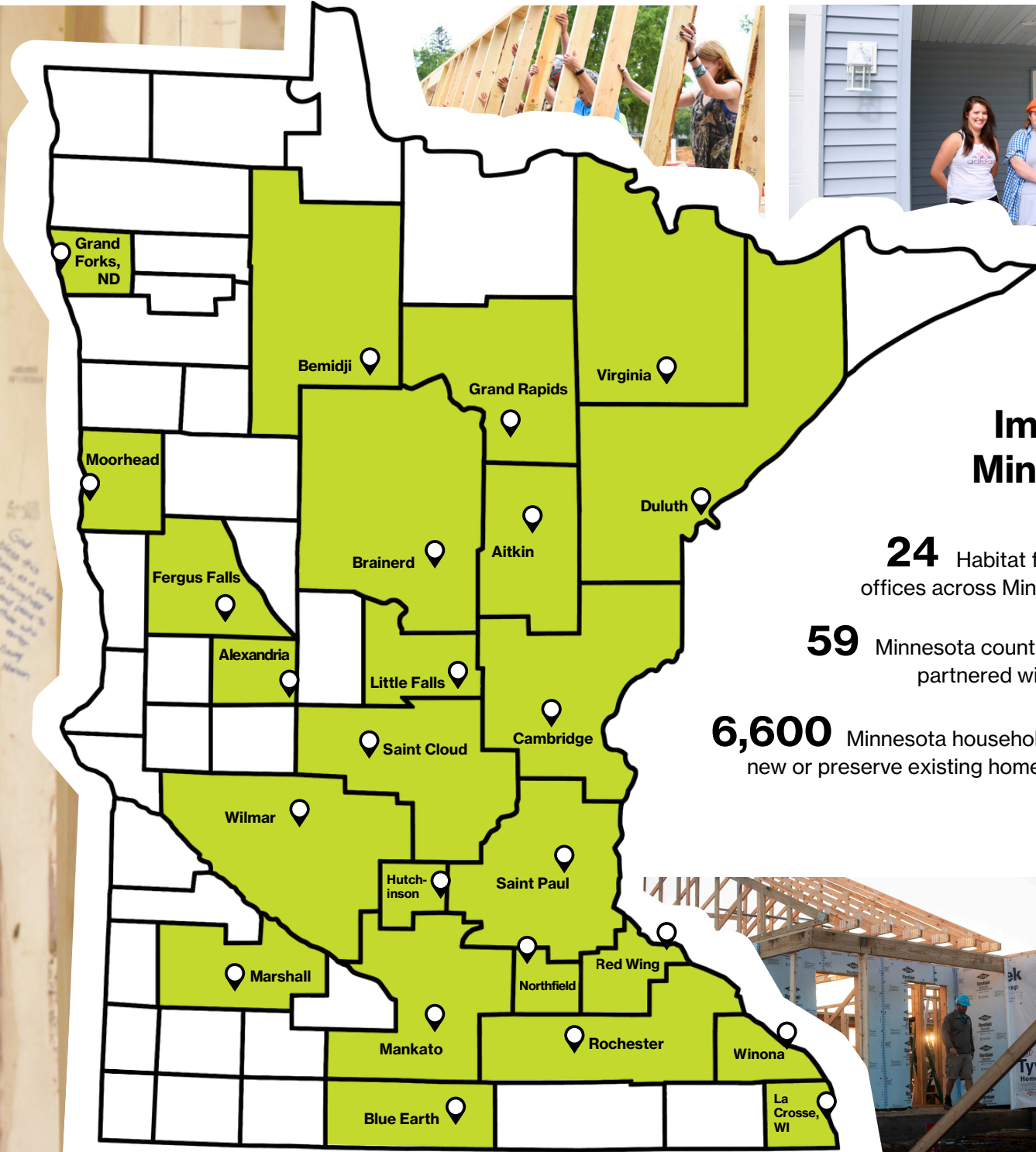
